







EXPRESSION OF INTEREST (EOI)

Venous Leg Ulcer Guideline Small Working Groups

The Hong Kong Enterostomal Therapists Association, New Zealand Wound Care Society, Wounds Australia and the Wound Healing Society, Singapore have formed a collaboration to review the Australian and New Zealand Clinical Practice Guideline for Prevention and Management of Venous Leg Ulcers, initially developed by the Australian Wound Management Association and New Zealand Wound Care Society in 2011.

The Venous Leg Ulcer Guideline Committee are now seeking expressions of interest for Small Working Group (SWG) volunteers. Volunteers will be acknowledged for their contribution by name in the updated guidelines.

The Evidence Review Group will provide Evidence-to-Decision frameworks and members of the SWGs will be required, within a given topic, to conduct panel discussions on the provided evidence, make informed judgments based on research evidence, draft a summary and recommendations for that topic based on the research evidence, and conduct robust discussions to support or reject the clinical recommendations. Each SWG will be allocated a Chair/Secretary role.

Small Working Group Member Qualifications and Expectations

- 1. Expertise and experience in the content area to be addressed by the SWG.
- 2. Expertise and a working knowledge of research methods sufficient for understanding of evidence reviews.
- 3. Free of major competing/conflicting interests. In the interest of transparency, potential SWG members will be asked to disclose in writing the nature of any competing/conflicting interest at the time of nomination.
- 4. NOT be primarily employed in related industry.
- 5. Have sufficient time to commit to the project and no plans for extensive leave.
- 6. Have sufficient computer literacy to use word processing software, a web-based interface for document sharing and web-based conferencing applications.
- 7. Meet electronically via online meetings once a fortnight for approximately three to four months (this may be adjusted according to workload requirements).
